Attached is the Long Term Pavement Performance (LTPP) Program Directive P-55. This directive is to provide information about photographs taking during Profile Measurements at Weigh-in-Motion (WIM) Locations.

Section 2.7.5.1 of LTPP Manual for Profile Measurements and Processing, May 2016, issued via Directive P-53, states "At WIM sites obtain images when collecting data along the wheel paths." Section 2.7.5.1 also provides two options for the collection of images. The intent is that during profile operations at WIM scale locations, only one set of photographs, preferably from the pass in the center of the lane (the wheel path) are required.
