Background

On September 14, 1998 the LTPP Directive GO-09, Policy for Monitoring Continuation on Rehabilitated Test Sections, was issued. The purpose of the directive was to establish guidelines that would allow test sections to remain in the program as they receive certain types of maintenance or rehabilitation treatments. Included in the guidelines was a date that the pavement construction must be completed by so that the test section could remain in the program. This date was established so that the new treatment would receive at least five years of monitoring with the assumption that monitoring of all test sections would cease in 2007. The current estimate is that monitoring will continue until 2009.

Modification to Directive GO-09

The *Guidelines for Monitoring Continuation on Rehabilitated Test Sections* are modified as follows:

On Page 2, in the section titled, "General Policy on Monitoring Continuation on Modified LTPP Test Sections", Paragraph 3, item number 3 is modified to read: **Pavement construction is completed and test section re-opened to traffic prior to January 1, 2004.**
